Announcement: Nash Hash 2023 will be run by Central Coast

There have been no other bidders, so Central Coast NSW is therefore the winning bidder for Nash Hash in 2023. Congratulations Joint Masters Patsy and Ballpoint! This is a break with traditional voting at Nash Hash but due to the postponement and to ensure timely delivery in 2023 we must declare the 2023 NASH HASH now.

Adelaide Nash Hash is still on schedule for November 2021 and gaining interest. In fact, we are reaching critical numbers and new rules apply for registrations.

We've previously announced that we can only handle a maximum of 900 attendees at Adelaide Nash Hash. We currently have 894 registration requests, 860 of whom have paid. If and when we get to 900 paid regos we're going to have to start a waiting list. Only those who have paid are considered fully registered and guaranteed a spot.

There are 41 overseas regos (32 paid) who don't yet know if they will be allowed to travel to Nash Hash, so there are likely to be some last minute changes. Overall there are 33 who haven't paid and who may miss out if rego numbers continue to rise. Please let us know (rego@adelaidenashhash.com) if you have decided not to come to Nash Hash.

Similarly, the Ladies Lunch requests must be paid to secure a place. Numbers are currently limited at the venue due to restrictions. If you haven't paid then let the organisers know your intentions.

The Red Dress Run is gaining interest and promises to be a good event.

COVID restrictions have just eased again in South Australia and we can now drink and dance at all our Nash Hash parties at the old Adelaide Gaol. Vaccinations have started and hopefully the worst of the pandemic is behind us. It's looking promising for a Nash Hash with minimal restrictions in November.

Ballpoint (Central Coast GM) was one of 17 interstate visitors who attended our Special Pre-Nash Hash Run in Adelaide on Saturday 20 March. A total of 57 visitors and locals signed on for the run and walk, long circle, BBQ lunch and a tour of the Gaol – all organised by the Hares Chesty and Icecan. You'll be pleased to hear that no Nash Hash funds were used!

On the same weekend over in Western Australia the Cervantes Poor Man's Nash Hash was attended by about 205 hashers. Poor Man's Nash Hash has become a tradition in the west for

those locals not travelling to Nash Hash. The assumption is you couldn't afford it, so a budget session is arranged to compensate. This year it was held early since Nash Hash was postponed but many will still come to Nash Hash. For \$25 a head they got a run and circle, lots of drinks, Saturday dinner, a one-man band and disco and Sunday breakfast! Most camped at the oval overnight.
